


- Continue Follow up for 1 year after graduating Butterfly Program







Last year, a few of our staff members worked with Tricia Hester on a research project about Cambodian Entertainment and Sex Workers Integrating into Christian Churches. The study was supported by the Oxford Center for Missions Studies.

In this research, the staff randomly selected and interviewed 29 former clients of Precious Women. These women had all completed the Vocational Training and Scholarship program.

The results showed that of the 29 women, only 3 women went back to work in the entertainment industry in either beer gardens or karaoke bars, and 2 women had unknown results for their current occupation. This is evidence of the lasting impact of their time with Precious Women and the value of the skills training that they received.

Esther's mother died 13 years ago and her father remarried and didn't care for his children anymore. Esther moved to live with her aunty and her 2 younger brothers. She is the oldest in her family so she has the responsibility to provide for her younger siblings.

Esther started working in the Entertainment Industry when she was in grade 9. Then she migrated to Japan to work as a farmer, but she was abused there and couldn't handle it anymore, so after 8 months she came back to Cambodia.

She began working in the Entertainment Industry again. She felt very hopeless because she couldn't earn much money to support her brothers, and she didn't have any skills she could use to find better work. She didn't want to live any longer.


Then Esther listened to Voice of Hope radio, and received counseling with Precious Women staff. She started to look at herself in a more positive way. She requested the opportunity for Precious Women to support her to study in university, and now she is studying Business Management.

She has a very strong commitment to study and she has found her gift and potential. She is now enjoying her life, and she has more hope. She is going to begin volunteering with Precious Women soon. She has a heart to serve entertainment workers also, and she always shares about Precious Women to other entertainment workers.



Expenditure for July 2016-June 2017



2018 Vision Goals

- 96 women working in the entertainment industry in Phnom Penh will understand their rights and labor laws, and be able to empower others, and advocate their rights to those exploiting them, through Empowerment Training
- 460 women will join together for Fellowship Parties and Special Events, to have a safe place to share their feelings, learn about God's love for them, and continue relationships with Precious Women staff
- 17 provinces will have increased public awareness of privacy and protection issues for entertainment workers, through weekly broadcasting of Voice of Hope radio
- 48 women will regain hope and dignity through Vocational Training, General Education, new job opportunities, and follow up care to be able to provide for themselves in an environment free from exploitation
- 24 women receive inner-peace, hope and a strong sense of self identity for emotional and physical well-being through Counseling and Health Support
