"I have two daughters and a husband who drinks alcohol a lot and uses illegal drugs. He beats me hard all the time. Because of so much physical trauma, my brain does not function well. We first lived in the province but my husband sent me to Phnom Penh and sold me to a Chinese man. He told me I will just cook for the Chinese man but after cooking, the Chinese man demanded me to sleep with him and told me that I was sold by my husband. My husband took the money before I came to Phnom Penh so I was forced to live with the Chinese man. After a month, I ran away from the Chinese man, but I did not know where to go. I was so ashamed of myself. I started selling myself for one month so I could earn money to go back home. But when I arrived home, I saw only my children. My mother said that my husband ran off with someone else. My neighbors in the province looked down on me so much, so I decided to go back to Phnom Penh but I could not find a job, so I started selling myself again because that was the only way to get money. One day, my neighbor encouraged me to stop doing sex work and that she knows an NGO that helps women like me. She brought me to Daughters. I saw many women and the staff assisted me. I never saw people that care for me until that day. At Daughters I feel so loved by everyone, they helped me a lot including giving me clothes and food because I had none, and taking care of my children in daycare whilst I am working. They counsel me and listen to me, especially the staff in medical clinic, she takes care of me so much, and my daughters too. I only started at Daughters one month ago, and soon I will get my first salary. The social work staff taught me how to use money wisely and save for my children. Daughters is like a family to me already, I cannot imagine myself without their help and love and care." - YSR, New Client

3 months ago, we decided to increase our intake from one to two new girls each week! We want to give to as many precious girls as we can the opportunity to start a new life. We run a new client group for the new clients, to give extra support to them in the first few months at Daughters, as we find that 50% drop out within the first three months, due to a chaotic lifestyle and short-term decision making. Thank you to everyone who sponsors individual girls, this helps us accept more girls each week, and we appreciate all your prayers for them too.

Medical Clinic

In our medical clinic, one of the ongoing issues we face is the lack of health knowledge among the clients. This stems from a lack education and literacy, but also a focus on only treating disease, rather than prevention. We regularly conduct health ed workshops, and have recently taught on these topics: Bacteria, Immunization, Disease Prevention, and First Aid. Thanks to our hardworking medical staff and our dedicated donors and sponsors, we have held over 1,380 appointments and 22 external referrals in the last 12 months.

We were very blessed to have Dr Scott White again this year to train our social work team and raise their skill levels. This year he conducted trauma treatment courses, training our team in how to treat trauma symptoms. Dr Scott is a Psychology Professor from the USA, and his partnership is a great blessing.

Testimony from a Former Client Who Has Been Recently Promoted to a Leadership Role:

"My dad he was addicted to alcohol, he got drunk almost every day and he cursing people in the family and neighbourhood. I



felt shameful and depressed everyday because of what he has done. I thought that no one loved me, no one liked me, and felt broken hearted with my family. I feel so much shame, I couldn't talk with people. Some time I sat and cry alone. Every day my father was cursing so bad and drunk, I got to the point that I tried to hang myself with a rope. People came to help me and my father said to me, 'If you wanna kill yourself, go away from my house somewhere else to die'. I was so brokenhearted. My life since coming to Daughters is so much better in my feelings and emotions. I have no more suicide thoughts , I just thinking about my future now. First in Daughters I learnt how to sew. Then I began studying accounting in University and now I'm in my final year. I got promoted to cashier last year and in December I got promoted again to be an Assistant Manager. This is a challenging job and I not learned it fully yet. At Daughters, I like the program like Teaching English and counseling services.

The program that help me to grow the most is worship, prayer time, and Bible class. After I came to know God in
